This project was made possible through a strategic collaboration between Tsunami and key partners, including SGMAI, Altice, Bravantic, Intel, and Microsoft.

The **Tsunami** brand, in collaboration with key partners, led a groundbreaking initiative to modernize Portugal's electoral process. This project involved equipping 308 municipalities with 29,000 customized devices, making it the first entirely digital electoral census in the country. The focus was on efficiency, security, and sustainability.
















THE CHALLENGE

The complexity of the project posed significant challenges:

Configuring and delivering 29,000 devices with specific requirements, such as integrated Smartcard readers and customized software.

Ensuring data security to prevent fraud and safeguard electoral integrity.

Coordinating nationwide logistics to guarantee timely delivery and reliable tracking.



THE SOLUTION

Tsunami's strategic approach addressed these challenges with a tailored solution:



Reliable Equipment

The **Tsunami PC Bolt W504**, featuring long-lasting batteries, a 3-year warranty, and integrated Smartcard readers, provided robust performance.



Advanced Logistics Management

Each device was assigned a unique identification, enabling precise tracking, while Altice ensured efficient nationwide deliveries.



Proactive Technical Support

A Network Operations Center (NOC) was established to provide real-time assistance, minimizing downtime and resolving issues promptly.
